## THE UC DAVIS EXPERIENCE



The UC Davis School of Education is partnering with Campus Recreation Youth Programs, scientists, researchers, designers, and educators from across the university, along with credentialed teachers from the community to provide a new, one-of-a-kind enrichment experience for children in grades 3–6, all while having fun. Camps will meet at the Rec Pool Lodge and will visit various sites on campus.

Campers work in teams to solve real-world challenges—promoting 21st century skills such as collaboration, communication, leadership, and critical thinking in a fun and exciting environment. Each week, campers engage in meaningful project-based learning while gaining valuable research and presentation skills developed in the context of authentic “laboratories” unique to UC Davis.

In addition to content knowledge, students explore a variety of communication and presentation technologies to enhance and demonstrate understanding. Groups are assigned a task to help their client promote a concept or service pertaining to their role in studying the world in which we live.

Price per camp is \$275. Camps are Monday through Friday of each week, 9 a.m.–3 p.m. Extended day care is available each week, please contact Youth Programs for details. Outlines of daily activities will be available mid-June.
